#### MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF FEBRUARY 2020



King County had **1.17 months' supply** of inventory (down from 2.09 months' of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **0.93 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.63 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

### MEDIAN HOME PRICE

FEBRUARY 2020



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$615,000** in King County and **\$494,263** in Snohomish County.



For single-family homes only, the median price in King County rose 3.05%, from \$655,000 a year ago to **\$675,000**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 8.43%, from \$474,947 to **\$515,000**.

In Seattle, the median single-family home price for February was \$730,500, a 0.07% increase from February 2019.

## **POPULATION**

The Puget Sound region's population as of April 1, 2019 was **4,198,400**.

Over the past year, the region added 63,740 people, as follows:

• King County +36,100

• Kitsap County +2,980

• Pierce County +11,080

#### **BUILDING PERMITS**


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

737 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of January 31, 2020)

YTD % Change Compared to 2019: -45%

## **JOBS**

Since 2010, the Puget Sound Region has added more than 464,000 jobs. We've added over 2.75 jobs for every housing unit.



The Washington unemployment rate for February 2020 is 3.8% and for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **2.6%**.

Construction employment in Washington increased by 2,800 between January 2020 and February 2020. Total employment in construction is **225,200 statewide**.
