MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF MAY 2021



King County had **0.42 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.74 months' of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **0.37 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.35 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

MAY 2021



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$775,000** in King County and **\$655,000** in Snohomish County.



For single-family homes only, the median price in King County rose 29.46%, from \$672,000 a year ago to **\$869,975**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 35.08%, from \$516,000 to **\$697,000**.

In Seattle, the median single-family home price for May was **\$919,000**, a 20.13% increase from May 2020.

BUILDING PERMITS


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

JOBS



The Washington unemployment rate for May 2021 is **5.3%** and for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **5.1%**.

Construction employment in Washington decreased by 2,600 between April 2021 and May 2021. Total employment in construction is **224,200 statewide**.
