King County had **1.66 months' supply** of inventory (up from 0.62 a year ago)



Snohomish County had **1.73 months' supply** of inventory (up from 0.49 a year ago)

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

AUGUST 2022



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$815,000** in King County and **\$700,000** in Snohomish County.



For single-family homes only, the median price in King County rose 5.88%, from \$850,000 a year ago to **\$899,999**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 7.93%, from \$694,900 to **\$749,999**.

BUILDING PERMITS


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

12,661 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of July 31, 2022)

YTD % Change Compared to 2021: +21%

JOBS



The Washington unemployment rate for July 2022 is **3.7%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **2.6%**.

Construction employment in Washington **increased by 1,800** between July 2022 and August 2022. Total employment in construction is **238,200 statewide**.
