MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF OCTOBER 2022



King County had **2.13 months' supply** of inventory (up from 0.57 a year ago)



Snohomish County had **1.83 months' supply** of inventory (up from 0.36 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

OCTOBER 2022



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$820,000** in King County and **\$699,475** in Snohomish County.




For single-family homes only, the median price in King County rose 12.22%, from \$824,270 a year ago to **\$925,000**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 5.04%, from \$695,000 to **\$730,000**.

The Housing Market Index (HMI) was **33** nationally, down 60.24% year over year.

In the West, the HMI was 28.

The HMI is based on a monthly survey of NAHB members designed to take the pulse of the single-family housing market.

BUILDING PERMITS


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

The Washington unemployment rate for October 2022 is **3.8%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3%**.

Construction employment in Washington **increased by 700** between September 2022 and October 2022. Total employment in construction is **237,600 statewide**.
