MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF NOVEMBER 2022



King County had **2.17 months' supply** of inventory (up from 0.38 a year ago)



Snohomish County had **1.89 months' supply** of inventory (up from 0.24 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four- to six-month level an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

NOVEMBER 2022



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$760,000** in King County and **\$685,000** in Snohomish County.




For single-family homes only, the median price in King County rose 2.5%, from \$820,000 a year ago to **\$840,500**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 2.16%, from \$695,000 to **\$710,000**.

DECEMBER 2022



The Housing Market Index (HMI) was **31** nationally, down 63.1% year over year.

In the West, the HMI was 25.

The HMI is based on a monthly survey of NAHB members designed to take the pulse of the single-family housing market.

BUILDING PERMITS


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

JOBS



The Washington unemployment rate for November 2022 is **4%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **2.9%**.

Construction employment in Washington **decreased by 500** between October 2022 and November 2022. Total employment in construction is **238,500 statewide**.
