MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY AS OF FEBRUARY 2023



King County had **2.26 months' supply** of inventory (up from 1.77 in January 2022)



Snohomish County had **1.71 months' supply** of inventory (up from 1.38 in January 2022)

Many industry analysts consider a four- to six-month level an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

JANUARY 2023



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$735,000** in King County and **\$668,800** in Snohomish County.




For single-family homes only, the median price in King County rose 5.8%, from \$775,000 a year ago to **\$820,000**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 1.4%, from \$715,000 to **\$724,900**.

The Housing Market Index (HMI) was **42** nationally, down 49% year over year.

In the West, the HMI was **37**.

The HMI is based on a monthly survey of NAHB members designed to take the pulse of the single-family housing market.



The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

122 Single-Family Permits (YTD as of January 31, 2023) YTD % Change Compared to 2022: **-39%**

293 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of January 31, 2023) YTD % Change Compared to 2022: **-81%**

The Washington unemployment rate for December 2022 is **4.6%**; for Seattle/ Bellevue/Everett it is **3.4%**.

Construction employment in Washington **increased by 2000** between December 2022 and January 2023. Total employment in construction is **236,700 statewide**.
