MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF FEBRUARY 2023



King County had **1.43 months' supply** of inventory (up from .55 in February 2022)



Snohomish County had **1.02 months' supply** of inventory (up from .41 in February 2022)

Many industry analysts consider a four- to six-month level an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

FEBRUARY 2023



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$760,000** in King County and **\$680,000** in Snohomish County.




For single-family homes only, the median price in King County decreased 2.1%, from \$857,750 a year ago to **\$840,000**. The median price in Snohomish County decreased 2.9%, from \$745,725 to **\$724,000**.

BUILDER CONFIDENCE

MARCH 2023



The Housing Market Index (HMI) was **44** nationally, down 46% year over year.

In the West, the HMI was **36**.

The HMI is based on a monthly survey of NAHB members designed to take the pulse of the single-family housing market.



The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

715 Single-Family Permits (YTD as of February 31, 2023) YTD % Change Compared to 2022: **-44%**

2,404 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of February 31, 2023) YTD % Change Compared to 2022: **-35**%

JOBS



The Washington unemployment rate for February 2022 is **4.6%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3.1%**.

Construction employment in Washington **increased by 6700** between February 2022 and February 2023. Total employment in construction is **236,600 statewide**.
