King County had **1.26 months' supply** of inventory (up from .83 in May 2022)



Snohomish County had **1.01 months' supply** of inventory (up from .85 in May 2022)

Many industry analysts consider a four- to six-month level an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

MAY 2023



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$830,000** in King County and **\$749,950** in Snohomish County.



For single-family homes only, the median price in King County decreased 1.8%, from \$998,888 a year ago to **\$980,500**. The median price in Snohomish County increased 2.6%, from \$815,000 to **\$793,500**.

BUILDING PERMITS


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

The Washington unemployment rate for April 2023 is **4.1%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3%**.

Construction employment in Washington **increased by 5300** between April 2022 and April 2023. Total employment in construction is **238,000 statewide**.
