### MEDIAN HOME PRICE

JUNE 2023



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$805,000** in King County and **\$717,691** in Snohomish County.



For single-family homes only, the median price in King County decreased 4.3%, from \$938,225 a year ago to **\$897,500**. The median price in Snohomish County increased 6.1%, from \$799,950 to **\$751,250**.

6,070 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of June 31, 2023)

YTD % Change Compared to 2022: -49%

## **JOBS**



The Washington unemployment rate for June 2023 is **3.8%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3%**.

Construction employment in Washington **increased by 4900** between June 2022 and June 2023. Total employment in construction is **239,500 statewide**.
