#### MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF JULY 2023



King County had **1.49 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.86 in July 2022)



Snohomish County had **1.07 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.88 in July 2022)

Many industry analysts consider a four- to six-month level an indicator of a healthy market.

#### MEDIAN HOME PRICE

JULY 2023



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$821,000** in King County and **\$700,000** in Snohomish County.



For single-family homes only, the median price in King County decreased 1.3%, from \$890,000 a year ago to **\$878,124**. The median price in Snohomish County decreased 6.6%, from \$770,000 to **\$719,342**.

## **BUILDING PERMITS**


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

3,498 Single-Family Permits (YTD as of July 31, 2023)

YTD % Change Compared to 2022: -29%

6,643 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of July 31, 2023)

YTD % Change Compared to 2022: -50%

## **JOBS**



The Washington unemployment rate for July 2023 is **3.6%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3.1%**.

Construction employment in Washington **increased by 4500** between July 2022 and July 2023. Total employment in construction is **240,900 statewide**.
