AS OF JANUARY 2024



King County had **1.8 months' supply** of inventory (down from 2.3 in January 2023)



Snohomish County had **.8 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.7 in January 2023)

Many industry analysts consider a four- to six-month level an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

JANUARY 2024



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$760,000** in King County and **\$700,000** in Snohomish County.




For single-family homes only, the median price in King County increased 8.8%, from \$781,098 a year ago to **\$849,850**. The median price in Snohomish County increased 4.4%, from \$699,000 to **\$729,990**.

The Housing Market Index (HMI) was **37** nationally, up 19% year over year.

In the West, the HMI was 28.

The HMI is based on a monthly survey of NAHB members designed to take the pulse of the single-family housing market.

BUILDING PERMITS


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

6,053 Single-Family Permits (YTD as of December 31, 2023)

11,201 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of December 31, 2023)

YTD % Change Compared to 2022: -43%

JOBS



The Washington unemployment rate for December 2023 is **4%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3.6%**.

Construction employment in Washington **decreased by 6300** between December 2022 and December 2023. Total employment in construction is **228,400 statewide**.
