#### MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF FEBRUARY 2024



King County had **1.5 months' supply** of inventory (up from 1.4 in February 2023)



Snohomish County had **.9 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1 in January 2023)

Many industry analysts consider a four- to six-month level an indicator of a healthy market.

## **MEDIAN HOME PRICE**

FEBRUARY 2024



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$820,000** in King County and **\$715,000** in Snohomish County.




For single-family homes only, the median price in King County increased 14%, from \$800,000 a year ago to **\$914,500**. The median price in Snohomish County increased 9%, from \$690,560 to **\$750,990**.

# **National and Regional HMI Change**



The Housing Market Index (HMI) was **48** nationally, up 14% year over year.

In the West, the HMI was 47.

The HMI is based on a monthly survey of NAHB members designed to take the pulse of the single-family housing market.

#### **BUILDING PERMITS**


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

**584 Single-Family Permits** (YTD as of January 31, 2023)

YTD % Change Compared to 2023: 63%

**505 Multifamily Permits** (YTD as of January 31, 2023)

YTD % Change Compared to 2023: 15%

## **JOBS**



The Washington unemployment rate for January 2024 is **4.6%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3.8%**.

Construction employment in Washington **decreased by 10,400** between December 2022 and December 2023. Total employment in construction is **226,300 statewide**.
