#### **MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY** AS OF DECEMBER 2016



King County had **0.73 months' supply** of inventory (down from .84 months of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **0.89 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.13 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

## **MEDIAN HOME PRICE**

IN DECEMBER 2016



The median price of single family homes and condos was **\$505,000** in King County and **\$379,350** in Snohomish County.



For single family homes only, the median price in King County rose 8.27 percent, from \$508,000 a year ago to **\$550,000.** The median price in Snohomish County rose 11.72 percent, from \$358,000 to **\$399,952.** 

In Seattle, the median single family home price for December was **\$600,000**, a 9.09 percent increase from December 2015.


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish and Pierce counties).

### JOBS

Since 2010, the Puget Sound Region has added 279,000 jobs representing a 16% increase. We've added over three jobs for every housing unit.



The Washington Unemployment Rate for December 2016 is 5.2%, and for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3.7%**.

Construction employment in Washington decreased by 400 between November 2016 and December 2016, due to job losses among specialty trade contractors. Total employment in construction is **191,400 statewide.**
